

## One Block Wonder Supply List Please take time to read this information!

Book Required: For this class you may (encouraged - but not required) purchase either book 1 or 2 , both contain the process I will be teaching you. Maxine Rosenthal has written 4 One Block Wonder books which can be purchased on Amazon.com \& CTPub.com:
The $1^{\text {st }}$ is "One Block Wonders"
The $2^{\text {nd }}$ is "One Block Wonders, Encore!"
The $3^{\text {rd }}$ is "One Block Wonders Cubed"
The $4^{\text {th }}$ is "One Block Wonders of the World"
Fabric Required: The Formula for the amount of fabric required is 6 repeats of fabric for the blocks. So if you have a 24 " repeat you would multiply $6 \times 24$ which = 144", divided by $36^{\prime \prime}=4$ yards for the blocks (but buy $4 \frac{1}{4}$ to be safe). If you are going to use the original fabric in the borders buy at least 6 YARDS.

Fabric Option 2: You may choose to use a panel. Panels are often 24 " wide by the Width of fabric (WOF). When using panels I buy 7 panels, six are for the 6 repeats needed. The $7^{\text {th }}$ panel can be placed somewhere on the front with hexagons designed around the panel.

To find the repeat, lay the fabric in front of you with the fold line near you. Find a design element which is easily identifiable near the fold, when it comes up again you have found the repeat.

## DO NOT PRE-WASH THE FABRIC!!!!

Fabric Considerations: The best fabrics for this process are large prints with little background, especially leaves or animals. The rule of thumb is once the repeats are aligned, we will be cutting them in $33 / 4$ " strips. If the design elements in your fabric are smaller than 4 " you will not be taking the design apart and your blocks will look like the original fabric. So choose LARGE PRINTS.

## Basic Supplies:

- Sewing Machine in good working order, Not Needed for the $1^{\text {st }}$ Class. The sewing is completed at home.
- Rotary Cutting tools: a rotary cutter with a new blade
- Rulers: one $6^{\prime \prime} \times 24^{\prime \prime}$ long for cutting the WOF Strips. \& a $6^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ with TWO 60 degree lines on the ruler. My favorite for cutting the triangles is the Olfa Frosted $6^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$.
- Mats: you will need a $36^{\prime \prime}$ and a 18 " mat that can be taped together with painters tape as we will be cutting fabric strips the Width of the Fabric (WOF)
- Flower Pins. These pins lay flat; flat enough for a ruler to be over them and the ruler will still be flat against the fabric
- Small Safety pins - For a quilt using a $24^{\prime \prime}$ repeat you will need $\mathbf{1 0 0}$ to $\mathbf{1 2 0}$ small safety pins. You can also use straight pins. Approximately $\mathbf{3 0 0}$ Straight pins for pinning rows together.

Pre Cutting: No precutting is required.

Note: Class I - Each student needs $48^{\prime \prime}$ of cutting space, and 6 square feet for design space. If design walls are not supplied, each student should bring 6 square feet of batting or flannel to tape to the wall for design the hexies.
